ORDINANCE NO. 2018-01

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, IN PART, ORDINANCE NO. 96-1, AN ORDINANCE STYLED "AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE VOLUNTARY CONNECTION TO A PUBLIC SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM TO BE LOCATED IN THE TOWNSHIP, ETC." BY REQUIRING CONNECTION TO A PUBLIC SANITARY SEWER UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH

THE TOWNSHIP OF ONEKAMA ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Amend Section 2.</u> Section 2 –Voluntary Connection of Ordinance No. 96-1, as amended by Ordinance No. 99-06, is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2 - Connection Required; Conditions

Any structure in existence in the Township on the effective date of the ordinance that amended this section that is located within 200 feet of a public sanitary sewer system shall connect to that system upon failure of the existing septic field or other sanitary waste handling or treatment facilities serving that structure, or at any time such connection is recommended by the District Health Department #10, the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality or any successor agency having jurisdiction over the system. Any structure in which sanitary sewage originates for which a land use permit is issued, and any existing structure that is so remodeled or reconstructed as to require the issuance of a state building permit, after the effective date of the ordinance that amended this section, shall connect to the system if the structure is located within 300 feet of the system. Structures required to connect to the system shall complete the connection within ninety (90) days of notice from the Township, the Village, District Health Department #10 or the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality that such connection is required.

<u>Section 2.</u> Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict and no further.

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption and publication as required by law.
