Describe the Current Facility before Improvement

Currently, there are no wastewater collection systems or treatment facilities within the project service area. All properties surrounding Portage Lake (outside of the Village of Onekama), Village of Bear Lake, Bear Lake Township and Pleasanton Township have privately owned, single connection, septic tank and drain field systems. Future water quality of the groundwater, Portage Lake and Bear Lake are becoming a significant concern due to increased development and redevelopment of existing homes and their reliance on mounded drain fields and holding tanks. The granular soils within this region and the high water table offer very little treatment before the wastewater enters the water table.

Describe the Current Facility after Improvement

The proposed facilities include constructing a low-pressure wastewater collection system around Portage Lake and Bear Lake that will connect to a regional treatment facility. The service area for these facilities includes properties surrounding Portage Lake (outside of the Village of Onekama), Village of Bear Lake, Bear Lake Township and Pleasanton Township. All collection facilities are proposed to be in existing public road rights-of-way or public lands, except for individual homeowner connections that will require permanent easements. In total, approximately 41.5 miles of main line pipe ranging from 1.25" HDPE to 8" HDPE, seven submersible pump stations, and 964 residential STEP pump stations will be installed to build out the collection system. A mechanical wastewater treatment plant with infiltration bed effluent disposal will be constructed in order to serve the collection system. Property acquisition will be made for the submersible pump stations and the wastewater treatment plant. Areas disturbed by the project will be restored with grass, roadway, sidewalk, etc. in an effort to return the land to its original state.


